

Sunday mornings to celebrate and learn about God





Romans 12:1-21

For Individuals and Life Groups

Introduction:

As a church we believe that “Bringing Jesus Into Life” (More than just a fancy slogan) is meant to point us to a life of total transformation. Spiritual gifts are a critical part of that transformation. Spiritual gifts are God-given ministry abilities that result in effective service for the purposes of God, they are part of our spiritual birth and they are diverse. As we work through this series ask God through his word, Spirit, and the input of others surface the ways in which you have been gifted for service.

Discussion: What comes to your mind when someone says Spiritual Gifts?

How do you see Paul’s teaching regarding grace gifts being related to “Spiritual worship”?



Into the scriptures



Read: Romans 12:1-21

What do you notice about the passage itself? (Structure, repeated words or ideas, unique words, main points...)

What name does Paul give to our response to God’s mercy? What does verse 1 teach us about what true worship is? What is it not?

Romans 12:1 sets the tone for this entire passage. Work through the passage and list the ways in which we are called to “offer our bodies as a living sacrifice.

It isn’t unusual to find an attitude in the church that the church is here to serve and fulfill me. What needs to change in your attitude and thinking regarding the church? How are you using your gifts to serve in the church and world? Spend time praying together as a group about this.
